

Costa Men's Mission Trip

When: February 1st-5th, 2023

Where: Iglesia Radical - Jaco, Costa Rica

Cost: Approximately \$900*

Summary of the Trip: As Beaches Chapel resumes international mission trips, we are excited to lead a group of men from our church on a trip to Jaco, Costa Rica to serve with Iglesia Radical. During our 5 day, 4 night trip, we hope to ignite the faith of men as they serve internationally with a group of likeminded believers. While serving in country, we will prioritize worship together, daily bible study/personal devotion, and intentional time to build deeper relationships with men on the trip. This trip will be a great balance of work and recreation, making it a perfect fit for those who have been or have never been on an international mission trip.

Frequently Asked Questions –

1. Does Costa Rica have COVID restrictions?

- a. Costa Rica has removed all COVID-19 restrictions such as vaccine requirements for travel, mask mandates, and social distancing measures.
- b. As with any country, there are some establishments that will require masks or proof of vaccinations, but those establishments are not included in our trip itinerary.

2. Can I Bring a Surfboard?

- a. Yes of course – but this expense is not covered in your mission trip costs. American Airlines charges extra for an additional checked bag and/or an oversized bag depending on your packing plans.

3. Is there free time?

- a. Yes – there will be a chunk of time for you to unwind/rest everyday.
- b. During this time, you can rest, shop, exercise, surf etc.

4. How much spending money should bring?

- a. When leaving the country, it's always important to have spending money on hand. We recommend a few hundred dollars on hand for things like shopping, emergency situations, small shop purchases (for places without card readers), etc.
- b. Note: Most meals are covered, with the exception of travel days and one dinner. Breakfast and lunch will always be covered though.

5. What is the food like?

- a. Costa Rica is like most other central American countries. They eat a diet oriented around rice, meats such as chicken or beef, fresh/local seafood, fresh produce, and fresh juices to drink. Jaco offers a wide array of foods however. There are restaurants that serve sushi, fast food, burgers, tacos etc. In other words – you will not go hungry – even if you are picky.

6. What are the accommodations/amenities like?

- a. We will be staying at a hotel near the beach in Jaco. Rooms will contain two queen beds (one person per bed, two people per room), be well air conditioned, have warm water, wifi, and fresh drinking water on hand.
